This collection will be an excellent addition to a private or public wine cellar. It would also be an exciting museum whether it is in a private home or a public place.





In the mid-19th Century when the Cavalry maneuvered or camped used these "corkscrews" for a corral for their horses. The screw posts could be set firmly in any soil and removed quickly when necessary. Ropes were strung through the upper loops of the posts to fashion a corral. It was a simple matter to unscrew the posts, load them in a wagon, coil the ropes and move out. Several sites in Kansas were discovered with these post many years ago.
