BZ03 Bacchus pressing grapes. Marked CGH ALP for C.G. Hallberg of Stockholm. Silver-plated. 5". \$165



BZo8 A heavy (9oz) knife marked DICKIE. Corkscrew and folding bottle cap lifter. Aluminum scales. Could be Japanese. 5". \$125





BZ09. Two bulldogs. Left is a heavy 10 ounce casting. Right is slightly larger in size and later production. \$95 for the pair.





BZ11 Magnificent large stag handle corkscrew with carved head and a lot of silver work. Marked 5578 in an oval, the letter S, and the Gorham Sterling maker mark. 10" x 6.5". Measuring from the nose the tail end on the curve is 12"+. \$1675



BZ12 Stag handle corkscrew with silver mounts. The bull head is finely detailed. It is marked STERLING THEODORE B STARK, NEW YORK (1900-1924). 8.5" x 6.5". The bell cap is Edwin Walker's April 17, 1900 U. S. Patent number 647,775. \$1475.



BZ13 Tusk with carved dog head. The silver mount is marked STERLING. The dog is missing the beads for eyes. You can find them in craft stores. The bell cap is Edwin Walker's April 17, 1900 U. S. Patent number 647,775. \$695



BZ16 A HUGE tusk with large silver mounts. The top mount is monogrammed and marked STERLING. Weighs 12 ounces. The large cap is dented from dummies using it to break ice. 8.75" x 6".

BZ17 Small tusk with a happy face carving
with a fancy cap. 4.5" x 4.75". \$675



BZ18 Superb stag handle corkscrew with a man's head peering out of the end. The back cap is monogrammed and has the Gorham mark and 1560 in an oval. Wrapped around the other is lots of silverwork showing grapes, vines & leaves. The top silver piece shows leaves. 8" x 6.25". \$1375



BZ19 Tusk with maidenhead carving. The bell and the stem need repair and refit into the tusk. (Take a less expensive bell/sleeve assembly and replace this one! – then you have a great corkscrew). The bell cap is Edwin Walker's April 17, 1900 U. S. Patent number 647,775. 5.25" x 6". \$495



BZ20 Stag handle corkscrew with carved elephant head. Monogrammed silver mount dented on top. Silver collar behind elephant head. 8" x 5.75".

BZ21 The beast! 8" x 5.75". \$875



BZ22 Stag handle with silver mounts. The large end is a detailed bull head. Marked STERLING. 8" x 6". \$1275.



BZ23 Boar's tusk with a boar's head silver mount. See next page for information about the girl on top. 8" x 5.25". \$2295



In 1881, Friedrich August Kaulbach's painting *Die Schutzenlies* was exhibited at the Munich Oktoberfest. The title was derived from the shooting events (*Schutzenfest*) held throughout German. The girl who posed for it was a 21-year-old waitress named Coletta. Her image was immortalized on advertising signs, statues, and steins. An early postcard tells the story that The **Blatz Brewing Company** exhibited the 8 ft. x 5 1/2 ft. painting at the 1893 Chicago World's Fair. Coletta would continue to appear in Blatz advertising for many years to come.



BZ25 Tusk beast carving. Lots of nice detail on the beast. The silver mount on the tail end has a small hole in it. The self-pulling bell is Edwin Walker's U. S. Patent 501,975, July 25, 1893. 7.75" x 5.5". \$1175



BZ26 Tusk carved as a horse hoof. It may have had a silver cap on the end at one time. Still a great looking piece. Bell, worm and shaft assembly in excellent condition. The bell cap is Edwin Walker's April 17, 1900 U. S. Patent number 647,775. 5.25" x 6". \$495



BZ27 Small tusk with a face carved on the end. Silver beaded collar in back of the face. Silver cap on the tail end. 4" x 3.75". \$495



BZ29 Small tusk with carved dog head. Silver collar and tail. The collar is marked STERLING. 3.5" x 4.25". \$525



BZ30 Beautiful horse head carved into the side of this large stag handle corkscrew. The silver cap is marked STERLING. The bell cap is Edwin Walker's April 17, 1900 U. S. Patent number 647,775. 8.5" x 6". \$975



BZ31 Carved deer is the handle for this open frame corkscrew with centering/raising button. 5.5" x 7.25". \$975



BZ32 Stag handle beast carving. 8.75" x 5.75". \$675

carved as a bird head. 5"

BZ44 Stag handle corkscrew with silver cap marked
STERLING 054. Theodor Fischer's 1902 German
Registered Design. 7.5" x 7". \$245





BZ45 Tusk handle corkscrew with silver mounts. The silver piece between the shaft and the handle is marked **STERLING**. Superb condition. A great centerpiece for a collection. The bell cap is Edwin Walker's April 17, 1900 U. S. Patent number 647,775. 5.25" x 6.75". \$725



BZ46 Henshall type corkscrew with stag handle. Beautiful shaft with serrated button with reeded edge. Fluted helix. The last turn is slightly distorted. 4.75" x 5.5". \$165





BZ55 Shaped walrus tusk handle corkscrew. The self-pulling bell is Edwin Walker's U. S. Patent 501,975, July 25, 1893. 6" x 6". \$39



BZ57 Stag handle corkscrew with brass fittings, one for a brush. 5" x 5". \$65

BZ60 French flynut corkscrew with bone handle, possible replacement. Crack across the top. 4" x 6". \$25



BZ64 Carved tusk showing a partially nude maiden. The decorative silver cap. Marked indistinctly STERLING. There is a 1/4" of movement of the sleeve and bell on the shaft. The bell cap is Edwin Walker's April 17, 1900 U. S. Patent number 647,775. 8" x 6". \$725



BZ65 Excellent small (only 3.25" x 4") tusk handle corkscrew with silver mount marked STERLING 925. Dated 4 4 02 (April 4, 1902). \$245





BZ68 Tusk corkscrew with Murphy style button. Monogrammed silver mount. Excellent. 5.5" x 5.5". \$285



BZ76 French Excelsior corkscrew with large tusk handle and silver mount marked STERLING 118 and on top of the “button” L'EXCELSIOR, A. G. BTE S.G.D.G. PARIS. . Armand Guichard’s French Patent No. 138,887 of November 25, 1880. 7.25” x 7.25”. \$375
